This page has the import requirements/permit phone number for each state as well as a link to their web site with their import requirements. These phone numbers and web addresses change from time to time but we attempt to keep them up to date to give practitioners a quick, easy resource to use when helping your clients ship animals to other states.

- For **International exports** of animals, animal germplasm or animal products out of the United States from Oklahoma, contact the USDA APHIS VS Oklahoma export staff at servicecenter4@aphis.usda.gov or 405-751-1701 Monday – Friday 7:00am – 4:30pm.
- A handy resource for information on International Pet Import and Export is www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/pet-travel . **Pets traveling to Mexico or Canada are considered to be International Movement**. Please keep in mind that Centers for Disease Control www.cdc.gov/importation/bringing-an-animal-into-the-united-states/index.html regulates the international importation of dogs, cats, bats, turtles, monkeys, civets, African rodents, and birds from foreign countries.
- For **International imports** of live animals, birds or germplasm, please contact National Center for Import and Export at email VS-Live.Animals.Import.Permits@aphis.usda.gov or call (301) 851-3300 option 2. Keep in mind that ODAFF requirements must be followed on livestock imported into Oklahoma.
- More options are becoming available for doing Certificates of Veterinary Inspection and other regulatory paperwork electronically. The mCVI app (no charge) allows practitioners to complete CVIs on desktop computers, iPhones, iPads, Android phones, and Android tablets. GlobalVetLINK (fee involved) is easy to use for completing CVIs and EIA tests, in addition to making writing FDA's VFDs quick and easy. New Planet Technologies has a new easily used electronic CVI which adds to the choices practitioners already have with VSPS and the Oklahoma eCVI.
