Reporting of any highly unusual condition, unusual clinical signs of any kind, and any instance of very high morbidity and/or mortality is required.

Characteristics of Reportable Diseases

High morbidity, high mortality

Vesicular lesions

Severe respiratory conditions

Neurologic symptoms

Poor or no response to treatment when response is expected

Does not fit classical picture

Severe abortion storms of unknown etiology

Hemorrhagic septicemia

Pox or lumpy skin conditions

Suspicious necropsy findings
